



Artist Curtis Goldstein painted a mural on an exterior wall of the Cotner Funeral Home in Reynoldsburg's old town district - on the corner of U.S. route 40 and state route 256(just off Main Street in between Cotner Funeral Home and Connell's Hardware Store)

The mural's dedication was on Saturday, December 5, 2009

The work is meant to reflect the city's place in the Historic National Road, the first federally funded highway which runs through the city; its agricultural heritage as the birthplace of the commercial tomato; and its commitment to education and the military.

Five Key Elements: The National Road, the Underground Railroad, Alexander W. Livingston and tomato cultivation, Hannah J. Ashton with education/Reynoldsburg schools and patriotism/the city's military history are the main themes (Reynoldsburg veterans are portrayed in the mural - Buddy Feuch, Maebelle Weber, a Sergeant in the Woman's Army Air Corps and 3 others)
